Office of Youth Services & Community Affairs Presents 2008 Winter/Spring Workshop Series

March 17, 2008 Back To Basics: Computer Training II, facilitated by Jackie Thomas

Kids-n-Technology is a non-profit organization that was founded in 2002 as the south's first technology camp, where children built their own PC- and took it home! The program now offers real world projects for adults so they too can experience the magic of technology. The first workshop will teach participants the basics of internet usage and how to set-up free e-mail addresses; and the second will teach the basics of word-processing.

April 17, 2008 City Code Enforcement, facilitated by Johnnie McKay

The purpose of the Department of Housing/Code Enforcement is to protect the public health, safety and welfare in existing buildings used for dwelling purposes. Some of the common complaints reported by citizens include abandoned houses and vehicles, structural defects in dwellings, and appliances or junk stored on property. This workshop will provide insight on how the Code Enforcement process works from beginning to end.

May 14, 2008 Recycle Memphis—It Revolves Around You, facilitated by Joy Williams

The City of Memphis Bureau of Solid Waste Management collects approximately 400,000 tons of solid waste each year from the curbs of Memphis streets. Of that amount, it is estimated that 30% or more is organic waste, commonly referred to as yard waste or brush. Consequently, with the advent of waste reduction laws and goals in the early 1990's, coupled with the desire of solid waste managers to manage yard waste more efficiently, a yard waste recycling program was developed in 1995. The recycling coordinator will discuss how recycling is still evolving in Memphis and she will talk about how citizens can engage in recycling projects to keep their neighborhoods clean and help save planet earth.

June 17, 2008 Stop Litter Tennessee, facilitator to be announced

\$11,000,000. Yes, you read those zeros right. That's \$11 million tax payer dollars Tennessee spends picking up trash thrown on the ground. That doesn't even count what Memphis pays to pick-up litter in the incorporated areas. This workshop will help Memphians understand what they can do to help keep Tennessee clean.
