Count on the YELLOW DOT

The Tennessee YELLOW DOT Program is designed to supply first responders with an individual's medical information in the event of an emergency.

This information can mean the difference between life and death in the "Golden Hour" immediately following a serious crash or injury.

WHY DO IT: Medical personnel can make the best decision regarding emergency treatment when they know a victim's medical conditions.

WHO SHOULD DO IT: Tennessee has over 4 million licensed drivers. Annually almost 50,000 of them are involved in some type of fatal injury incident.

EVERYONE CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE "YELLOW DOT" PROGRAM: The participant voluntarily provides their medical information, and authorizes the disclosure to, and use of, the medical information by emergency responders and other responders for the purpose of offering assistance when involved in an incident.

You should only call 9-1-1 in EMERGENCIES – when you or someone else is seriously hurt or is experiencing life-threatening conditions. An emergency is any situation that requires the immediate assistance of a police officer, firefighter or emergency medical services.

~ Keys locked in vehicle (no child inside)

*Calling 9-1-1 for a non-emergency ties up phone lines that could be servicing real emergencies—and is also against the law in many states.
